The following rules apply to all six individual events. All entrants must work in, own a restaurant that makes pizza or be involved somehow in the pizza industry. Competitors must provide the music for their routine on a CD labeled with their name and track number before the competition starts. Contestants must be 18 years of age or older. All events will be judged by an impartial panel of judges with backgrounds in the pizza industry.

Competition Agreement - Competitor agrees to comply with all World Pizza Games® rules and regulations, and gives permission for Pizza Today™, Pizza Expo®, and World Pizza Champions™ to use his or her name, restaurant name, photo or image for promotional purposes.

Official Abbreviated Rules for World Pizza Games® - Page 2

Freestyle Acrobatics - First Division - Competitors will perform a two-to-five minute acrobatic dough tossing routine set to the music they have provided. Each competitor will be given ten (10) 8-ounce dough balls and five (5) minutes to prepare their dough. Two dough balls will be formed together to make one dough, giving each competitor five (5) doughs. Competitors are permitted to bring their own dough. If competitor brings his own dough, that competitor may use as many as he or she chooses. Refrigeration will be provided however, there are no guarantees to the safety of the dough. Rolling pins will be provided and you are allowed to bring your own. Water bottles may be used to wet down dough. Competitors will be judged in the following areas using a ten-point scale: Dexterity, Difficulty Level, Synchronization, Variety, and Creativity/Entertainment Value. Judges will consider the following: dough needs to spin continuously, and transition from trick to trick needs to be seamless. Juggling and crowd reactions will not influence the scoring. Judges' scores are final. In the event of an obvious unfair score, the remaining judges may, by majority vote, disallow a single score and replace it with one that is an average of the remaining scores. The top three winners will move into the final round where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given. The 1st place winner will also have the option of then participating in the Freestyle Acrobatics - Masters Division. Contact event organizers to determine eligibility of First Division.

Freestyle Acrobatics - Masters Division - This Division of the Freestyle Acrobatics is for the best of the best. If you have previously won a Gold Medal in Freestyle Acrobatics at the World Pizza Games® or at a comparable international competition abroad, then you may qualify for this event. If you feel that you are qualified for this event, please contact event organizers or tony@worldpizzachampions.com. If you qualify for the Masters Division, then you may be ineligible to compete in the First Division. All placements are at the discretion of the event organizers. All other rules for First Division apply to Masters Division. No preliminaries or trials will be held for Masters Division. All competitors will compete at the finals where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given. Space is limited to 5 competitors.

Fastest Dough - The goal of this competition is to see who can toss out five (5) doughs to cover five (5) pizza screens in the shortest amount of time. Dough balls will be 10 ounces in weight and 12 inch pizza screens will be used. Contestant may use hands only to toss out the dough ball and each dough must completely cover each screen with no metal showing. All repairs must be made while the clock is running - judges will point out repairs on the fly. There will be no "fix it time". Judges will stop the clock once all doughs properly cover the screens and all holes have been properly repaired. Times will be measured to the hundredth of a second and will be shown to the contestant. Otherwise scores will be kept confidential until the end of the event. The top five winners will move into the final round where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given.

Largest Stretch - The goal of the largest stretch is to see who can toss out the largest dough in five (5) minutes. Largest measurement wins. Dough balls will be 18 ounces in weight. Competitors may use hands and elbows to toss out their dough to the largest size possible in five (5) minutes. They may NOT use legs, feet or head. Contestants may work dough on table provided or in the air as they see fit; however, dough may not be placed onto the floor before 4.40 minutes have passed. Once on the floor, the competitor is free to stretch and anchor the dough as they see fit. Contestants are permitted to pick up the dough off the floor and work in air or on the table again. At the end of five (5) minutes, the dough must be placed on the floor in the designated area so it can be measured. Judges will count down time in 30 second intervals until 4 minutes 50 seconds is reached. At that time they will count down the last 10 seconds and announce "STOP". The competitor must immediately raise their hands into the air and back away from the dough. Dough must be in a predominately round/oval shape. Square, rectangle, star, or similar shapes are not allowed and will be disqualified. Measurements will be shown to competitor but all scores will be kept confidential until the end of the event. The top five winners will move into the final round where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given.

Fastest Pizza Box Folding - Goal is to completely and properly fold five (5) 12" pizza boxes as fast as possible. Boxes will be placed on competition table with outside of box face down. Competitors may not touch the boxes until the competition starts. Any boxes that fall on the floor must be picked up and placed on the table. The competitor will signal to the judge when they are ready, and the judge will count down "3-2-1-GO". Judge will start stopwatch on "GO". In the event of a mis-start by competitor, they may be disqualified. In the event of a malfunction of the stopwatch, the judge will immediately stop the competition. Table will be reset with fresh boxes and the contest will start again. Time will be recorded down to the hundredth of a second. The top five winners will move into the final round where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given.

Longest Spin - The goal of this competition is to spin an 18-ounce dough over your head using one hand in a traditional pizza throwing stance for as long as possible. The 18-ounce dough will be rolled out to a 12" round shape for the competitor and placed on the competitor's table. Competitors may use one or two hands to initially throw the dough into the air, but may only use one hand after the initial throw. After the initial throw, competitor must use the same hand for the duration of the spinning and may not switch to the other hand. Dough must stay above competitor's head and continually spin. Time will stop once the dough falls below head level, is dropped, becomes unmanageable, becomes un-spinable, or stops spinning. Times will be measured to the hundredth of a second and will be shown to the contestant. Otherwise scores will be kept confidential until the end of the event. The top five winners will move into the final round where 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given.
